SHSM certifications can be offered in almost all areas of the arts and culture — everything from Graphic Design to Special Effects Makeup. Our instructors are industry professionals and experienced teachers, and we oversee the design of all training programs. Certifications include a 2 hour in-person or virtual workshop delivered by a trained professional, and preparatory/follow-up materials totaling 1-2 hours, which you can pass along to your students.

2. SHSM Certifications available for Arts & Culture, PLUS Other Sectors

The following virtual and in-person programs can be offered for Arts and Culture students, **or for groups of students in any and all Sectors**. Activities include role-play, drama games, case studies, group presentations and team challenges to teach principles in a practical and engaging manner.

Equity & Allyship

In this workshop we address questions of equity and diversity as they relate to the workplace, and examine inequities relating to gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, and (dis)ability. Practical and discussion-based activities encourage students to position themselves as allies in our journey to a more equitable society.

Conflict Resolution

Students explore strategies to tackle and resolve conflict in the workplace and beyond. This training program makes use of role play, drama games and self reflection to address essential skills.

Communication Skills

How do we communicate effectively with one another? Students explore body language and oral communication as it relates to a variety of situations to be encountered in the workplace and in life.

Public Speaking Skills

Working in pairs, small groups and finally as a whole group, students learn public speaking skills including speech writing, body language and communication — they apply them practically.

Customer Service

In this hands-on workshop we focus on the principles of CIRP: Communication, Integrity, Respect and Problem-Solving, using role-play, communication strategies and case studies to highlight the importance of customer service in all industries.

Leadership Skills

In this training program we identify and practise a variety of leadership skills using practical activities. Students learn the importance of promoting leadership skills in themselves, and in others.

Entrepreneurship

What are the skills required of a successful entrepreneur? This training program makes use of case studies, but also applies key strategies to the students' own ideas.

Stress Management Techniques

Learn to master techniques that will help you succeed in stressful situations. This workshop includes a self-analysis component, and practical examples of stress management strategies.

3. Sector-Partnered Experiences through Centauri Arts

Over the past 26 years, our businesses have encompassed almost all areas of the arts, so we are well placed to offer students the opportunity to engage with real-life industry challenges. Most of our arts endeavors are youth-focussed, so it is easy for students to connect with our objectives.

A Sector-Partnered Experience with Centauri Arts

Our SPE is a full day (6-hour) event for students that takes place in your school. It includes a wide range of interactive and engaging activities: games, group work, presentations, discussions, role play and solo reflection. Students explore the ICE principles in a practical manner, then apply them twice: firstly, to a career goal or business idea of their own, and secondly to a real-life industry problem connected to their Sector. Students receive a Workbook packed with ideas, information and industry anecdotes. Each SPE ends with a self-evaluation.

Students from different schools may be combined in a single SPE, and we are happy to combine different Sectors, too. We offer SPEs for a wide range of Sectors, in addition to Arts and Culture.

A Sample 6-hour, In-School Sector-Partnered Experience

- 9.00 Arrival; leadership activities to explore the value of ICE
- 10-00 Working solo and in pairs, students participate in activities to identify an ideal business venture based on their interests and skills. They apply Innovation, Creativity and Entrepreneurship to their idea, in order to expand it into a viable proposition.
- 11.30 Students are introduced to an industry challenge related to their sector. They work in groups to generate solutions.
- 12.00 Lunch
- 12.45 We use a 'speed dating' system of rotation, as students test their ideas out on one another.
- 1.30 In their original groups, students settle on a solution to the industry problem, and prepare a presentation
- 2.45 Students present their solutions
- 3.15 Students discuss the solutions generated, and the industry leader presents their perspective
- 3.30 Self-evaluation and final observations



The Virtual SPE Option

For remote schools, or in the case of further lockdowns, a virtual SPE can be offered. This consists of asynchronous activities, and a 2.5 hour virtual workshop.

The asynchronous portion consists of:

- A video presentation introducing students to our company and to the principles of ICE
- A workbook. This includes activities that will help students to relate ICE to their interests and skills

The 2.5-hour virtual workshop consists of:

- An interactive look at how ICE can be used to generate solutions to industry challenges
- The presentation of a real-life industry challenge
- A group project in which students generate solutions to the challenge presented
- Group presentations and self-evaluation
